

KS2 Data Comparison - 2016 / 2017 /2018

This is the third year of the new Key Stage tests in maths, reading and GAPS (Spelling, punctuation and grammar). The tests assess children against a national standard. Pupils' results in each test are reported using a scaled score. A scaled score of 100 represents the expected standard for each test. If your child achieves a scaled score of 100 or more it means they are working at or above the expected standard in the subject. A score of 110 or higher would mean that your child is working at 'Greater Depth' which shows he/she has mastered that area of the curriculum. If your child achieves a scaled score of less than 100, it means they may need more support to reach the expected standard. The highest scaled score possible is 120 and the lowest 80.

Our results are, once again, extremely pleasing. Crabtree pupils performed well above the national average in all subject areas.
