

Comparative Report

2016 is the first year of the new Key Stage 2 tests in maths, reading and SPAG (spelling, punctuation and grammar). The tests assess children against a national standard.

Pupils' results in each test are reported using a scaled score. A scaled score of 100 represents the expected standard for each test. If your child achieves a scaled score of 100 or more it means they are working at or above the expected standard in the subject. A score higher than 110 would mean that your child is working at "Greater Depth" which shows he/she has mastered that area of the curriculum. If your child achieves a scaled score of less than 100, it means they may need more support to reach the expected standard. The highest scaled score possible is 120 and the lowest 80.
